The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

A telephone message was received on the day of the hearing from the respondent in this case to state that she would not be attending the hearing.

Determination:

The Tribunal has listened to the evidence adduced by Mr. McAllister of behalf of the employer. The Tribunal accepts that on the 13th of July 2006 his employee tendered her resignation. Having worked for a period greater than the 13 week period stipulated in the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001, the employee was obliged to work out her minimum notice of one week. The employer's entitlement to one week's notice is set out in Section 6 of the Act. In failing and refusing to complete the one week's notice stipulated, the Tribunal finds that the employee was in breach of Section 6 of the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001.
