The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent was on notice of the hearing. The appellant was dismissed by the respondent on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2006. The respondent phoned the appellant from the United States of America where he resides and told the appellant that he was closing the shop where the she worked with immediate effect. The appellant sent a redundancy claim form, RP50, to the respondent but this had been returned unopened. The appellant was also due eleven days holidays at the time of dismissal.

Based on the uncontested evidence of the appellant the Tribunal is satisfied that a redundancy situation existed. Accordingly, the Tribunal finds that the appellant is entitled to payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2003, based on the following criteria:

Date of commencement: 15<sup>th</sup> October 2004 Date of Termination: 4<sup>th</sup> November 2006

Gross pay: €317.75

The Tribunal also finds that the appellant was due eleven days holidays and accordingly awards her €699.05 under the Organisation of Working Time Act, 1997.
