Determination

The claimant told the Tribunal that on 13 April 2007 she gave her employer two weeks notice and she was asked to leave. She did not receive notice pay and during her time with the respondent she accrued seven days holidays, which she did not get paid for.

On the uncontested evidence of the claimant the Tribunal allows the claim under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001 and awards the claimant compensation in the amount of €673.00 which is equivalent to one weeks' gross pay. The Tribunal awards the claimant

compensation of €942.20 (this being seven days gross pay) under the Organisation of Working

Time Act, 1997.
