The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

The fact of redundancy was not is dispute. Four successive companies employed the claimant. He believed that there was a connection between the companies. The respondent denied any legal connection with the claimant's previous employers, saying that they were all separate and independent companies. A contract of employment was produced to establish the claimant's date of commencement with the respondent.

Determination

The Tribunal considered the evidence adduced and the documents presented in this case. The Tribunal finds that the claimant did not have continuity of service. Therefore he is not entitled to a Redundancy payment. The claim under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 fails.

The Tribunal is satisfied that the claimant received notice of his dismissal. The claim under the

Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001 fails.
