The hearing of this case was scheduled to commence at 10.30am. The Tribunal waited until 11.15am before proceeding with the hearing.

Claimant's case:

In sworn evidence, the appellant said that by way of a telephone call, his employment was terminated without notice. With the assistance of the Citizens Information Service, he had completed the T1-A form (*Notice of Appeal*) in respect of his claim for redundancy. The appellant confirmed the details of his employment for the Tribunal.

Determination:

The Tribunal was satisfied that the notice of hearing was properly served on the respondent in accordance with its procedure and based on the information supplied on the T1-A form. However, there was no appearance by them or on their behalf.

Accepting the uncontested evidence of the appellant, the Tribunal finds that the claim under the
