The determination of the Tribunal was as follows:

Determination:

The appellant was employed from 2003 and among his responsibilities was the sanitization of the respondent's equipment at their client's premises. In March 2008 a redundancy situation arose in the respondent and most of the employees were made redundant. The respondent had issues with the appellant's work performance but these issues were never brought to his attention. The appellant's P45 was given to him on 14 August 2008 by the managing director with no mention of redundancy pay and no suggestion that his performance was unsatisfactory.

The Tribunal is satisfied that a redundancy situation pertained in the appellant's case. The respondent never brought the questions about the appellant's performance to the appellant's attention before dismissing him. Accordingly the Tribunal is satisfied that the appellant is entitled to a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2003 based on the following criteria

Date of Birth19 August 1958Employment commenced14 August 2003Employment ended14 March 2008Gross weekly pay€430-00

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period. The Tribunal further awards €860-00, being two weeks' pay, under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001
