The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

Determination:

The respondent stated that all entitlement that had been due to the claimant had been paid and they had treated her very well. Because the claimant did not have a work permit, they had to terminate her employment. To have continued employing the claimant without a valid work permit would have been illegal and the respondent would not engage in such a practice.

The claimant did not appear at the hearing on 4 February 2009. A period of liberty was granted by the Tribunal so as to allow the claimant make contact with the Tribunal in regard to her claim. However, the Tribunal received no further contact from the claimant.

As the claimant failed to appear at the hearing or make further contact with the Tribunal, her claim under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2001 is dismissed for want of prosecution.
