The decision of the Tribunal was as follows: -

The appellant worked for the respondent behind the bar from October 2004. On the 4th of May 2008 the appellant arrived for work to find the premises closed down. The appellant was later informed that the premises had been closed by the Gardai and would not re-open. The appellant tried unsuccessfully to contact the respondent regarding her Redundancy and Minimum Notice appeals.

Determination

After hearing the uncontested evidence of the appellant the Tribunal finds that the appeal under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 To 2003 succeeds. The appellant is entitled to a Redundancy Lump sum based on the following criteria.

Date of Birth:	10 th December 1981
Date employment began:	1 st October 2004
Date employment ended	4 th May 2008

Gross weekly pay: €250.00

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.

The Tribunal allows the appeal under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts 1973 to 2005 and awards the appellant the sum of €500.00 being the equivalent of two weeks pay.
