The appellant's were placed on temporary lay off and signed Forms RP9 on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2008. They completed Part B of Form RP9 on various dates between 1<sup>st</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> October 2008, thereby giving notice to the respondent of their intention to claim Redundancy
