The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

Determination:

The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent was notified of this hearing. Neither the respondent nor representatives on its behalf appeared at the hearing. The Form T1A had been sent to the address in Northern Ireland furnished by the appellant and which was described as the respondent's head office. A Form T2 was returned from the office in the Northern Ireland on behalf of the respondent and attaching a letter stating that due to financial difficulties the company was no longer in a position to continue the employment of the appellant. In this letter it was also stated that a liquidator was to be appointed on behalf of the creditors. The Tribunal notes that at the date of the hearing the status of the respondent company was normal. The Tribunal also includes the second named respondent at the address as registered in the Companies Registration Office.

Based on the uncontested evidence of the appellant the Tribunal finds that she is entitled to a redundancy lump sum under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 based on the following

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criteria:	
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Date of birth18th May 1973Date employment commenced9th April 2002Date employment ceased27th January 2009Gross weekly pay€310.82

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.

Having considered submissions from the appellant, the Tribunal allows the appeal under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2005 and awards the appellant €1243.28 as compensation for four week's notice.
