The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

There was no appearance by the respondent. The respondent's representative stated that the respondent was seeking protection against bankruptcy through the Courts and that he did not have the funds to pay the appellant's redundancy payment. The respondent's representative did not dispute the facts of the case.

The first named appellant (rp922/09) gave evidence that he commenced his employment on August 21st 2006 and finished on March 27th 2009. The respondent told him that there was no more work.

The second named appellant (rp923.09) gave evidence that he commenced his employment on

January 24th 2005 and finished on March 27th 2009. The respondent told him that there was no more work.

Determination:

The Tribunal finds that a redundancy situation existed and that the appellants are entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following information:

These awards are made subject to the appellants having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period. It should be noted that a statutory weekly ceiling of €600.00 applies to payments from the Social Insurance Fund.
