The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

This order corrects the original order dated March 18th 2010 and should be read in conjunction with that order.

Determination

The Tribunal cannot hear the appeal under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991. Accordingly it has no option but to decline jurisdiction because of Section 7(2) of the Payment of Wages Act, 1991, which provides:

"An appeal under this section shall be initiated by a party by his giving, within 6 weeks of the date on which the decision to which it relates was communicated to him-

(a) a notice in writing to the Tribunal containing such particulars (if any) as may be specified in regulations under subsection (3) and stating the intention of the party concerned to appeal against

the decision, and

(b) a copy of the notice to the other party concerned."

The Tribunal is not satisfied that s.7 (2) (b) above has been complied with and therefore it is satisfied it does not have jurisdiction to hear the appeal of the Rights Commissioner under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991.

The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

This case came before the Tribunal as a result of an appeal by an employer (the appellant) against a decision of the Rights Commissioner under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991 **R-063765-PW-08/POB**, in the case of an employee (the respondent) and under the Terms of Employment Acts, 1994 to 2001 **R-063761-te-08/POB**.

At the outset the respondent's representative conceded that her client had received written terms of employment but was unaware of this information on the day of the Rights Commissioners hearing as the appellant company had not attended on that day. This being so the Tribunal has no alternative to allow the appeal thereby upsetting the recommendation of the Rights Commissioner in respect of the Terms of Employment Acts, 1994 to 2001.

Determination

The Tribunal cannot hear the appeal under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991. Accordingly it has no option but to decline jurisdiction because of Section 7(2) of the Payment of Wages Act, 1991, which provides:

"An appeal under this section shall be initiated by a party by his giving, within 6 weeks of the date on which the decision to which it relates was communicated to him-

(a) a notice in writing to the Tribunal containing such particulars (if any) as may be specified in regulations under subsection (3) and stating the intention of the party concerned to appeal against the decision, and

(b) a copy of the notice to the other party concerned."

The Tribunal is not satisfied that s.7 (2) (a) above has been complied with and therefore it is satisfied it does not have jurisdiction to hear the appeal of the Rights Commissioner under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991.
