The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

### Determination: (appellant 1)

At the outset of the hearing the claim under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2005 was withdrawn in respect of appellant 1.

The respondent conceded that a redundancy situation existed. The Tribunal awards the appellant a redundancy lump sum under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 based on the following criteria:

Date of Birth	23 <sup>rd</sup> December 1957
Date of Commencement	15 <sup>th</sup> September 2005

Date of Termination	6 <sup>th</sup> March 2009
Normal Weekly Remuneration	€700

This award is subject to the appellant having been in employment, which is insurable for all purposes under the Social Welfare Consolidation Act 2005.

It should be noted that a statutory weekly ceiling of €600.00 applies to payments from the Social Insurance Fund.

**Determination: (appellant 2)**

Both parties agreed that the appellant was entitled to two weeks minimum notice. The appellant had received payment in respect of one week's minimum notice and payment of one week was outstanding. The Tribunal awards the appellant €820 compensation (being the equivalent of one weeks pay) under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts 1973 to 2005.

The respondent conceded that a redundancy situation existed. The Tribunal awards the appellant a redundancy lump sum under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 based on the following criteria:

Date of Birth	17 <sup>th</sup> May 1995
Date of Commencement	23 <sup>rd</sup> January 2006
Date of Termination	21 <sup>st</sup> February 2009
Normal Weekly Remuneration	€820

This award is subject to the appellant having been in employment, which is insurable for all purposes under the Social Welfare Consolidation Act 2005.

It should be noted that a statutory weekly ceiling of €600.00 applies to all payments from the Social Insurance Fund.
