The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

## **Determination:**

The appellant is the Executrix of the deceased. The deceased was seriously ill but continued to work for the period of time he was receiving treatment. He was absent for a period of some months.

The contract he had been managing had come to an end and he was not replaced. We are satisfied a de facto redundancy existed in December 2008 but the exact terms were not agreed at that point and the required documentation were not completed due to his illness.

Accordingly the Tribunal find he is entitled to a redundancy lump sum under the Redundancy Payments Acts 1967 to 2007 based on the following criteria:
