The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

A director of the respondent company submitted that the appellant is entitled to a redundancy payment. He did not dispute the appellant's appeal for a redundancy payment. The appellant gaveevidence that on May 29<sup>th</sup> 2009 her employer told her that the shop was closing immediately. Shedid not receive a redundancy payment or payment in lieu of notice.

Determination:

The Tribunal finds that a redundancy situation existed and that the appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following information:

Date of Birth: $21^{st}$  October 1968Date of Commencement: $14^{th}$  February 2006Date of Termination: $6^{th}$  June 2009Weekly Gross Pay:€291.65

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.

The Tribunal awards the appellant €291.65 in respect of one week's notice under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts 1995 to 2005.
