The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

There was no appearance by or representation on behalf of the respondent company. The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent company was on notice of the hearing.

The appellant gave evidence that his employment with the respondent company, as a labourer, commenced on March 6th 2006. When he went on holidays on December 28th 2007 his employer gave him a P45. When he returned in January 2008 his employer told him to go to the Social Welfare office, as there was no work for him. He was re-employed two or three weeks later on January 28th 2008. He was again given a P45 when he went on holidays from September 19th 2008 until October 13th 2008 and May 15th 2009 until June 22nd 2009. His employment was terminated on July 30th 2009 due to lack of work.

Determination:

Based on the uncontested evidence of the appellant the Tribunal finds that a redundancy situation existed and that the appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following information:

Date of Birth:20th May 1973Date of Commencement:6th March 2006Date of Termination:30th July 2009Weekly Gross Pay:€400.00

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.

The Tribunal heard that the claim under the Organisation Of Working Time Act, 1997, was previously dealt with by a Rights Commissioner and accordingly the Tribunal dismisses the claim under this Act.
