The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

There was no appearance by or representation on behalf of the respondent company. The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent company was on notice of the hearing. The appellant gave evidence that her employment with the respondent company commenced on August 14th 2006. On November 9th 2009 she was put on temporary lay-off. On December 8th 2009 the appellant returned the form RP9 with part B completed in order to seek a redundancy payment. The appellant was neither offered work nor given a redundancy payment.
