The declaration of the Tribunal was as follows:-

Upon the administration of the company the complainant claimed arrears of holiday pay and arrears of unpaid wages from the Insolvency Fund.

Section 6(6) of the Protection of Employees (Employers' Insolvency) Act, 1984, states that the Minister for Social Protection shall not make any payment under this section in respect of any debt until he has received a statement in prescribed form from the relevant officer of the amount of that debt which appears to have been owed to the employee on the relevant date and which appears to remain unpaid.

On behalf of the Minister, the Department of Social Protection refused the claim of the complainant on the grounds that the administrator of the company, from the company records, had not been able to certify the claims as correct on the requisite form.

The complainant lodged a complaint under section 9(1)(a) of the Protection of Employees (Employers' Insolvency) Acts, 1984 to 2004 in order to pursue her claim for arrears of holiday pay and unpaid wages.

Determination

Having considered the submissions of the complainant the Tribunal is satisfied that the complainant is entitled to payments from the Insolvency Fund under the Protection of Employees (Employers' Insolvency) Acts, 1984 to 2004.

The Tribunal awards the claimant \in 108.96 as payment in respect of outstanding holiday pay due and \in 72.64 in respect of unpaid wages.

These awards are made subject to the complainant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.
