The determination of the Tribunal was as follows:

## Determination

At the outset the Tribunal raised the issue regarding the name of the respondent. It was stated by the Chair that the business name has no standing. The owner is a sole trader and not a registered company and therefore the name should read XXXXXXX. The respondent accepted the name issue. It was also accepted by the respondent that a redundancy situation existed.

Accordingly the Tribunal finds that the appellant is entitled to a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 based on the following criteria.
