The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

The first appellant (JK) claimed that his employment, which commenced on 5 June 2007, ended by reason of redundancy on 4 June 2010. His gross weekly pay was €600.00.

The second appellant (PW) claimed that his employment, which commenced on 11 June 2007, ended by reason of redundancy on 28 May 2010. His gross weekly pay was € 400.00.

The third appellant (MOC) claimed that her employment, which commenced on 2 October 2006, ended by reason of redundancy on 28 May 2010. Her gross weekly pay was €540.00.

The fourth appellant (ABJ) claimed that his employment, which commenced on 15 January 2007, ended by reason of redundancy on 28 May 2010. His gross weekly pay was €325.00.

The fifth appellant (KPJ) claimed that his employment, which commenced on 26 November 2007, ended by reason of redundancy on 4 June 2010. His gross weekly pay was €420.00.

The sixth appellant claimed that his employment, which commenced on 1 August 2006, ended by reason of redundancy on 4 July 2010. His gross weekly pay was €358.00.

There were no breaks in the appellants' service.

No contest was offered by the respondent who had not been in a position to pay redundancy lump sums following a downturn in his business twelve months prior to the hearing.

## **Determination:**

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the first appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth:19 May 1961Date of commencement:05 June 2007Date of termination:04 June 2010Gross weekly pay:€600.00

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the second appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth:09 March 1975Date of commencement:11 June 2007Date of termination:28 May 2010Gross weekly pay:€400.00

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the third appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth: 21 April 1980
Date of commencement: 02 October 2006
Date of termination: 28 May 2010
Gross weekly pay: €540.00

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the fourth appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth: 28 September 1989
Date of commencement: 15 January 2007
Date of termination: 28 May 2010
Gross weekly pay: €325.00

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the fifth appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth: 14 May 1987

Date of commencement: 26 November 2007
Date of termination: 04 June 2010
Gross weekly pay: €420.00

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the sixth appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth: 05 November 1974
Date of commencement: 01 August 2006
Date of termination: 04 July 2010
Gross weekly pay: €358.00

## Note:

Payments from the Social Insurance Fund are limited to a maximum of €600.00 per week.

These awards are made subject to the appellants having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.
