The determination of the Tribunal was as follows:

There was no appearance by or representation on behalf of the respondent. The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent was on notice of the hearing. The claimant's representative withdrewthe claim under the Unfair Dismissals Acts, 1977 to 2007, at the outset of the hearing. The claimant gave evidence that her employment as a journalist ceased when her employer closed thebusiness.

Determination:

Based on the uncontested evidence of the appellant the Tribunal finds that a redundancy situation existed and that the claimant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following information:

Date of Birth: 25^{th} June 1976Date of Commencement: 4^{th} June 2007Date of Termination: 10^{th} July 2009Weekly Gross Pay: $\notin 400.00$

This award is made subject to the claimant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.

The Tribunal awards the claimant €800.00 (eight hundred euro) in respect of two weeks' pay under the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts, 1973 to 2005. The date of termination has been amended to reflect this award.
