The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

Preliminary Issue:

The appellant's form was received by the Tribunal outside the stipulated 52-week time limit. The appellant explained that he had not received a P45 from his employer. The appellant had mistakenly assumed that he required this document to claim his redundancy lump sum.

Determination on Preliminary Issue:

The Tribunal finds that the time limit can be extended from 52 weeks to 104 weeks as provided by the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007.

Based on the appellant's uncontested evidence the Tribunal finds that he is entitled to a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following criteria:

Date of Birth: 7th March 1982
Date of Commencement: 4th December 2000
Date of Termination: 10th June 2009

Gross Weekly Pay: €588.00

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.
