The respondent conceded that a redundancy situation existed, but contended that he could not afford to pay the redundancy lump sum payment.

Determination:

Based on the respondent's submission the Tribunal finds that a redundancy situation existed and that he is entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, based on the following information:

Date of Birth: 19th October 1971
Date of Commencement: 1st February 2007
Date of Termination: 24th March 2009
Weekly Gross Pay: €320.25
