The decision of the Tribunal was as follows: -

## Determination

The respondent company was struck off the companies register on 15 January 2012. The appellant received a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts based on an employment start date of September 2007. The appellant had been employed from March 2005 but the respondent took the view that there had been a break in service of some four weeks in August/September 2007 when the claimant went on holiday to his homeland. As the respondent hired temporary labour for this period he issued the appellant with a P45 at that time. The Tribunal was satisfied that there was continuity of employment such that the appellant was entitled to a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007 based on the following criteria.

Date of Birth Employment commenced Employment ended 21 September 1978 7 March 2005 16 October 2009 Gross weekly pay

This award is made subject to the appellant having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Consolidation Act, 2005 during the relevant period.
