## **Determination**

The appellant worked initially as a salesman and subsequently as a carpet fitter for the respondent company which operates a retail furniture business. In total the appellant worked for the respondent company for almost 5 years until the termination of his employment in July 2010. There was a dispute between the parties as to whether the claimant was dismissed for misconduct or by reason of redundancy. On the basis of the evidence adduced the Tribunal finds that a genuine redundancy situation did not exist and the claims under the Redundancy Payments Acts 1967 to 2007 and the Minimum Notice and Terms of Employment Acts 1973 to 2005 fail and are hereby dismissed.
