The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

The first appellant (HK) claimed that her employment, which commenced on 1 September 2003, ended by reason of redundancy on 14 January 2011. Her gross weekly pay was \in 355.20.

The second appellant (YD) claimed that her employment, which commenced on 8 December 2007, ended by reason of redundancy on 14 January 2011. Her gross weekly pay was €346.00but it went down to €276.80 (for her final year-and-a half of employment) after she had a baby.

No evidence was offered by or on behalf of the respondent.

Determination:

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the first appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth:	23 October 1982
Date of commencement:	01 September 2003
Date of termination:	14 January 2011
Gross weekly pay:	€355.20

Given that the second appellant's gross weekly pay became a lesser amount during the course of her employment the Tribunal assesses her gross weekly pay for the purposes of her redundancy lump sum at €293.50.

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the second appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details:

Date of birth:	21 July 1981
Date of commencement:	08 December 2007
Date of termination:	14 January 2011
Gross weekly pay:	€293.50

Note:

These awards are made subject to the appellants having been in insurable employment under the Social Welfare Acts during the relevant period.
