## **Determination**

This is an appeal from the decision of the Minister under the Act to make a payment of only €9,474 in respect of an award under the Unfair Dismissals Acts 1977 to 2007 of €15,000. That lower figure was arrived at by applying a cap of €600 per week instead of the claimant's gross pay of €950 per week.

The Rights Commissioner finding is interpreted by the Tribunal as being based on a net weekly pay of €730 not on a gross weekly figure of €950, and this was carried forward to the Tribunal appeal.

The appellant's representative agreed that the payments from the Social Insurance Fund would be subject to a cap of €600 per week, but argued that the calculation should be different.

The Tribunal therefore varies the calculation made by the Department of Social Protection by substituting a divisor of  $\in$ 730 for the figure of  $\in$ 950 arriving at a figure of  $\in$ 12,329. Allowing credit for the sum of  $\in$ 9474 already paid the Tribunal makes an award in favour of the appellant of  $\in$ 2855.

The Tribunal notes that the previous award and this determination are based on payments which were already net of tax.
