This case came before the Tribunal by way of an employee appeal of the Rights Commissioner Decision **ref: r-092836-pw-10** under the Payment of Wages Act, 1991.

## **Background**

The appellant was a participant in a Community Employment Scheme working for the respondent; a limited company. The respondent company was set up in line with Community Employment Project guidelines as directed by FÁS. The company is directly funded by the Government through FÁS.

In January 2010 the appellant's wages were reduced from €228.70 per week to €216.00 per week. The reduction in wages was not discussed with the appellant, her consent was not sought and it is not mentioned in her most recent terms and conditions of employment, signed in February 2009. The appellant's wages were reduced as a result of a Directive issued by FÁS; the reduction in wages was not based in statute. The Directive was not communicated to the respondent staff.

The Rights Commissioner found that the reduction was not an authorised one as prescribed in the Act. The appellant maintains that the respondent did not proffer any accounts at the Rights Commissioner hearing to substantiate the finding that 'the financial circumstances outlined by the Respondent appear to have justified the reduction in wages and as allowed for
