The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:-

The first appellant claimed that his employment, which commenced on 9 January 2005, ended without prior notice by reason of redundancy on 1 April 2010. His gross weekly pay was €931.86.

The second appellant claimed that his employment, which commenced in February 2002, ended without prior notice by reason of redundancy. His gross weekly pay was €525.72.

No evidence was offered at the hearing by or on behalf of the respondent.

## **Determination:**

Under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2007, the Tribunal finds that the first appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum based on the following details (after his due notice period is taken into account):
