The Tribunal is satisfied that the respondent was properly notified of this hearing. Neither the respondent nor a representative on its behalf appeared for this hearing.

The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

Section 15 2B (b) of the Redundancy Payments Act, 1967 as amended by the 1979 Act reads as follows:

Where the employee temporarily accepts the reduction in remuneration or hours of work and indicates his acceptance to his employer, such a temporary acceptance for a period not exceeding 52 weeks shall not be taken to be an acceptance by the employee of an offer of suitable employment in relation to him.

The appellant in this case continued to work on a temporary agreement in excess of fifty-two weeks albeit under protest and in the continuing expectation that her working week would be eventually restored to her former permanent full time status.

In considering this case the Tribunal finds on balance that the ongoing objections by the appellant to her changed working hours and wages were sufficient to allow her appeal under the Redundancy

Payments Acts,	1967 to 2007.	Accordingly, t	he Tribunal	awards the	appellant	a statutory	lump	sum
under the above	Acts, and base	ed on the follow	wing:

A Statutory lump sum payment in the amount of  $\in$ 5094.72 has been discharged and accepted by this appellant in this case.
