### **Background**

At the outset the respondent objected to this claim being heard by the Tribunal on the grounds of the Tribunal having no jurisdiction to do so.

It was common case that the claimant worked and was ordinarily resident in Poland during his employment with the respondent from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2010 to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2011. However he paid tax and PRSI to the Irish Revenue Commissioners and it was the contention of the claimant that he was therefore entitled to have his claim for unfair dismissal heard by the Tribunal under the Irish Unfair Dismissals Acts, 1977 to 2007.

The respondent told the Tribunal that although the claimant's contract of employment showed an Irish address for him and stated that he was to work in Ireland that in fact he lived andworked in Poland and that as such the Tribunal had no jurisdiction to hear this claim. Therepresentative for the respondent referred to a previous decision of the Tribunal Ref: UD874/93.

# **Determination**

Having carefully considered the evidence adduced at the hearing the Tribunal is satisfied that

even though the claimant paid tax and PRSI to the Irish Revenue Commissioners during his employment with the respondent he was not ordinarily resident in Ireland but was resident and worked in Poland.

While the Act does not exclude the claimant, it does not admit him. If however, the claim could be heard in this jurisdiction, it is quite clear that the proper law governing the contract of employment is Polish law. The Tribunal is not competent to decide questions of foreign law and it's jurisdiction is confined to such matters as the Irish Parliament bestow upon it.

The Tribunal therefore declines jurisdiction in this case.
